Big Lottery Fund Breathing Places Grant for York Cemetery

In June 2008 York Cemetery Trust was awarded a £10,000 Big Lottery Fund Breathing Places Grant (Phase 3) to:

- Improve and develop a large area within the original Victorian part of the Cemetery.
- Improve footpaths
- Carry out essential tree surgery

Progress so far ...

- A large area adjacent to the Fernery, known as the Victorian Woodland, has been cleared of dense bramble.
- To complement the existing mature trees in the Victorian Woodland, white flowered fragrant Magnolia trees have been planted.
- A number of wildlife friendly Rowan trees were already established and in addition to these wonderful red berried trees, a contrasting variety has been planted, providing white flowers in the spring and pink-tinged fruit in the autumn.
- The area has been under planted with a carpet of Snowdrops and Wild Garlic, to provide a spectacular succession of white flowers from late winter until early summer.
- A new footpath has been laid at the front of the Cemetery and sections of paths have been repaired in the Victorian part of the Cemetery.
- Some essential tree surgery has been completed and some more work is planned in February.
